A one-pager is a collage of illustrations and written analyses on one page that make up an aesthetically pleasing and detailed interpretation of a subject, art form, or piece of literature.

You should spend at least thirty minutes reading and/or brainstorming ideas before you begin decorating your page. Use a standard size piece of blank paper (8.5 x 11) or you may use a template provided for you.

	Include one theme from the book and explain why you think that is the theme.

	Include the description of one symbol or significant event from the book.

	Explain briefly the main conflict of the book.
