


Hades: King of the Dead; Lord of the Underworld

Like Zeus, Hades is usually represented as a vigorous bearded man. Hades was born to the Great Mother goddess Rhea and Kronos (Father Time) on the island of Crete, along with his brothers Zeus and Poseidon. Hades sprung out of the earth and captured Persephone, dragging her off to be his queen in the Underworld. Her mother Demeter searched for her and stopped all foods from growing until Persephone was returned. Finally, a deal was worked out where Persephone stayed one-third of the year with Hades, one-third of the year serving as a handmaiden to Zeus at Mount Olympus, and one-third with her mother.
